Our finances


The year 2023 was unique for the Council's finances. A restricted \$700,000 estate gift allowed us to shore up our investment portfolio, while a continued return to normal in-person programming, for both the Council and our grantees, increased mission-related expenses. Administrative costs remained largely level from 2022, representing 21% of our total expenses. This allowed us to dedicate a higher percentage of spending to total programs and grants.

Our 2023 revenue was bolstered by an increase in funding from the NEH, an improvement in the Council's investment portfolio performance compared to the preceding year, and the major restricted gift noted above. The uncharacteristic revenue in 2023 is expected to return to more typical totals and ratios in 2024.





The Council held administrative costs level from 2022 to 2023, allowing us to devote 75% of our total spending in 2023 to grants and programs. A reduction in development expenses was due to preparations for a major fundraising initiative in 2024, as the Council marks its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a series of public events throughout the coming year.
